Attendance

Following the launch of our new attendance initiative, I am pleased to share that six classes achieved the target of 97% attendance last week. Three of them were Year 3 classes who earned an extra playtime as a result! Well done all six classes and fingers crossed for Monday when the next attendance heroes will be revealed.

Teaching and Learning

Where required, children have been busy completing assessments in reading, phonics and maths. These assessments provide essential information for teachers to use when planning learning opportunities.

One of our school development priorities this year is to support our children to become more independent and have the confidence to have a go. Some children worry about getting things wrong. It is important for our children to know that making mistakes is an integral part of the learning process and that it is ok. Teachers analyse mistakes and use them to plan next learning steps. At school, we share this mantra in individual classes as well as in Collective Worship. Endurance is one of our core values after all! I am asking for your help by reiterating this to your children.

Every learning unit is staffed at playtime for children that need to finish off work they were expected to complete during lessons. Teachers use their professional judgement when deciding if a child needs to access this extra support. It is rare a child does not access any playtime at all.

Collective Worship

Rev Jonathan Bish will be leading an act of collective worship next Tuesday. We area really looking forward to this. Children always enjoy his visits!
