Maths

In maths we will focus on the unit shape and geometry. We will be concentrating on consolidation and problem solving skills. We will also continue to develop our times table knowledge through the use of TT Rockstars.



Reading

Our reading curriculum

All of the children take part in comprehension lessons three times per week, developing their skills of inference, retrieval, prediction, summarising, ordering and broadening their understanding of vocabulary. Each week the class also take part in 'Book Talk' which gives them the opportunity to discover and discuss different texts that they might be interested in.

Love of reading

We love to listen to stories and at the end of every day during our "listening for pleasure" time we have been listening to *The Hobbit*, *A Place Called Perfect* and *There's a Boy in the Girl's Bathroom*.

Religious Education

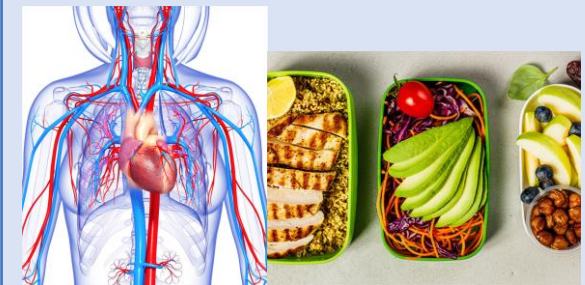
This unit focuses on exploring the responsibilities and opportunities that arise as young people grow into adulthood. It investigates religious and secular responses to growing up, including rites of passage. As part of the study, pupils consider their own values, beliefs and commitments. The main religions covered in this unit are Christianity, Judaism and Sikhism.



Science

Animals including humans

We will be focusing on identifying and naming the main parts of the circulatory system, recognising the impact of diet, drugs and exercise and describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within humans and animals.

The children will research and prepare a three-course meal and taste-test and score their food. They will research the journey of their main ingredient from 'farm to fork' or write a favourite recipe.

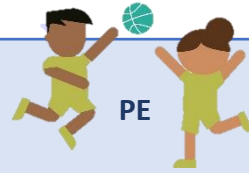
Humanities

History

Our History unit is: Industrial Revolution. We will learn about the factors that led to the Industrial Revolution and the main technological advancements during this period. We will focus on the impact that canals and railways had on the Industrial Revolution and why some people were opposed to the Industrial Revolution.

Geography

Our geography topic will focus on geographical skills including map skills and local land use.



Outdoor – This term we will be looking at striking and fielding and bootcamp fitness.

Indoor - Our Summer Term topic is Sports hall Athletics.

PSHE

Healthy Me – Being and keeping safe and healthy

The children will learn about emotional and mental health, managing stress and how to create a self-care plan. They will learn about drugs and how this can lead to exploitation through county lines and gang culture.

Computing



Online safety – We will be learning about cyber bullying and the impact of reading news online.

Coding– We will be completing a unit on coding developing the skills we have worked on throughout Bywell.

Music



Children will continue to learn keyboard skills and performing as part of an ensemble. They will also continue to develop reading musical notation.

Outdoor learning

Children will be learning how to identify cardinal directions within the school grounds. They will follow a planned route around the grounds and use Ordnance Survey maps and symbols to identify land use of an area. They will practice using a 6 figure grid references to locate a specific place on an O/S map.
